"The Theology of Conversion" Pastor Kent Groethe

The road to Emmaus story is a paradigm of how people are converted to Christ. Every conversion has four participants. All four are essential actors involved whenever someone comes to a saving faith in Jesus Christ:

1. SATAN

"Their eyes were kept from recognizing [Jesus].

Luke 24:16

"The god of this age [Satan] has blinded the minds of unbelievers, so that they cannot see the light of the gospel." 2 Corinthians 4:4

Jesus told Paul he was sending him to people to "open their eyes, and turn them from darkness to light, and from the power of Satan to God."

Acts 26:18

2. THE HOLY SPIRIT

"Their eyes were opened, and they recognized [Jesus]."

Luke 24:39

"Were not our hearts burning within us while he talked to us on the road and opened the scriptures to us."

Luke 24:32

"I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with his gifts." Luther's explanation of 3rd article of AC.
